Needleworker's Night Light

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Materials needed:

- Kreinik #12 Braid 4001 Green Tea, 4002 Spiced Chai, 4005 Sugar Cube, 4006 Rosehip (our new colors!)
- 8"x 10"Treasure Tape Sheet (heavy duty double-sided tape)
- Diamond Beadlets
- Night Light with blank shade (muslin)
- old needlework chart you can cut up
- Miscellaneous buttons
- scrap of white paper to make a shade template
- pan or tray



Instructions:

- I. Using a scrap of blank paper, trace the area of the shade. Cut out, then lay on your large sheet of Treasure Tape. Trace, then cut out this shape, so that you now have a matching sized shade area out of the Treasure Tape.
- 2. Remove the white backing from this cut piece of tape, and lay on the blank white night light shade. Peel off the red liner to expose the sticky top.
- 3. Cut up your old needlework chart into scraps of various sizes, and place randomly on the sticky shade. We are going for a 'crazy quilt' look, so leave some space between each chart piece to decorate with thread.
- 4. Using colors of #12 Braid, decorate these blank spaces between chart pieces. When decorating is complete, hold shade over a pan or tray and cover all remaining sticky areas with Diamond Beadlets.
- 5. Cut scraps from your remaining Treasure Tape to use in adhering buttons to shade. Remove the white liner, attach tape to button. Remove the red liner, attach button to shade.
- 6. Enjoy!

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
