

Speckled Knif Hat

Designed for Kreinik by

using Kreinik Reflective Yarn

Dots of contrasting color give this hat a Nordic look. A double strand of Reflective Yarn is carried along in these areas. Worked circular, k2, p2 ribbing holds the lower edge in snuggly. Decrease rounds shape the top.

SKILL LEVEL

Intermediate

FINISHED MEASUREMENTS

Circumference: 21" and Height: 9"

MATERIALS

- Kreinik Reflective Yarn, 53% glass beads/ 22% polyester/12% phenolic resin/13% adhesive: (1) 25-yd spool
- Brown Sheep Lamb's Pride Bulky, 85% wool/ 15% mohair (4 oz/ 125 yds per skein): 1 skein each #140 Aran (MC) and #02 Brown Heather (CC)
- Size 7 (4.5mm) double-pointed (dpn) and 16" circular needles or size needed to obtain gauge
- · Stitch marker

GAUGE

15 sts x 18 rnds = 4" in pattern To save time, take time to check gauge.

DESIGNER NOTES

- Two strands of Reflective yarn are held together with CC throughout hat. Carry CC/Reflective yarns up work; do not cut them until directed.
- Reflective yarn is most effective when it is toward the outside of stitch.

DOT PATTERN

Rnds 1-3, and 5-7: With MC, knit. Rnd 4: *K2 MC, k1CC/Reflective, k1 MC; rep from * around. Rnd 8: *K1 CC/Reflective, k3 MC; rep from * around. Rep Rnds 1-8 for pat.

HAT

With MC anc circular needle, cast on 80 sts. Join without twisting, placing marker between first and last st. Ribbing Rnd: *K2, p2; rep from * around.

Work even in ribbing for 1_". Change to Dot pat and work even until hat measures approx 8" from beg, ending with Rnd 1 of pat. Change to dpn. Dec rnd: *K2tog around – 40 sts. Work Rnds 3 and 4 of Dot pat. Cut CC/Reflective yarns.

Rnd 5: Ssk around -20 sts.

Rnd 6: Knit.

Rnds 7 and 8: Rep Dec rnd – 5 sts. Cut yarn and draw through remaining sts twice. Pull yarn through to inside and weave in end.
